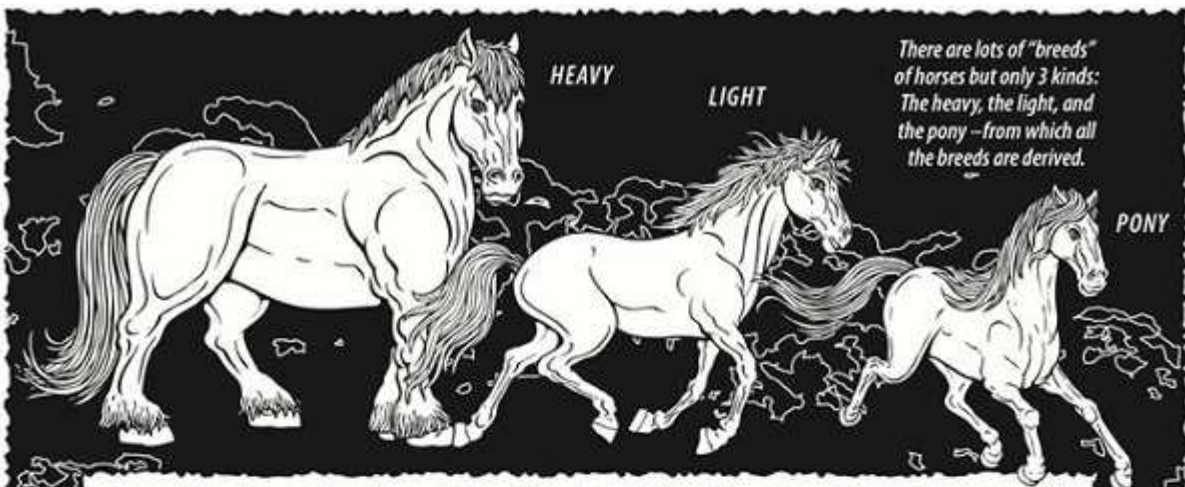

The carpet has been cleaned and will be ready to go at the next meeting, plan on coming early to the meeting so that we can set up tables and chairs, the more people we have that faster the job gets done. The weather is going to get warmer and we are all ready in Day Light Saving Time so working horses and getting them ready for shows will also take more time. This Spring Horse Show is our number one money making project and we help in getting sponsors.
